What to see and do: See lots of sandhill cranes (500,000 estimated visit the area each year); thickest in Grand Island to Kearney stretch; other areas to think about: Overton to Elm Creek section of the Platte River; North Platte to Sutherland section of North Platte River

- Rowe Sanctuary
 - o Blinds available: \$25 plus tax per person per visit; reservations required
 - Nice visitor center
 - Best for sunrise or sunset viewing
- Crane Meadows
 - o Blinds available: \$25 per person plus tax per visit; reservations required
 - 455 foot pedestrian bridge crosses channel of Platte River; \$5 for tour
 - Blinds best for sunrise or sunset viewing; bridge sounds like it might be good all day but sunset best
- North Platte area/Buffalo Bill Ranch State Historical Park, North Platte
 - Cranes are all over the fields here during the day as they feed
 - o Buffalo Bill Ranch State Historical Park has a blind in state recreation area; no fee
- North River Drive
 - Just drive along the river and watch in the fields
- Roadside turnouts
 - o Two along Platte River Drive west of Doniphan
 - One west of Rowe Sanctuary office located southwest of I-80 exit 285 near Gibbon on Elm Island Road
- Public viewing decks
 - Alda Crane Viewing Site (two miles south of Crane Meadows Nature Center near Alda interchange on I-80 exit 305)
 - o Richard Plautz Crane Viewing Site (1 mile south of I-80 Gibbon interchange at exit 285)
 - Need to arrive at least an hour before sunset for both to get a spot as these get crowded on weekends
- Hike/bike bridge that crosses Platte River at Fort Kearney State Recreation Area
 - Southeast of Kearney
 - State park permit required per car (either \$3 or \$15)
 - o I-80, exit 279, 3 mi s on SR 10, 3 mi w on CR 50A.
 - Visitor center open 9-5
- West Platte River Drive
 - Just drive along the river and watch in the fields

Items to note:

- Drive from Fort Collins to Kearney is about 5 hours without stops (I-25 to Cheyenne then east on I-80)
- This is anticipated to be the prime/peak migration weekend
- There is a crane conference in Kearney this same weekend
